






## A MESSAGE FROM SHAY

## LISTENING SESSION

March, 29th, 2022 Virtual





uring the early stages of the pandemic, our Tax Clinic was heavily impacted when on-campus service delivery came to a screeching halt. At the same time, our work-integrated learning opportunity program for students were also impacted.

Rising to the challenge and adjusting to our new way of operating, we were able to shift our Tax Clinic service completely online, by partnering with Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP) and hiring student volunteers to support.

Students got the opportunity to practice their accounting skills through facilitating returns, answering tax related inquiries and problem solving. In a time where there were little job opportunities, we are glad to have provided these students with meaningful professional work experiences.

For this upcoming Tax Clinic 2022, we have 21 student volunteers hired for this work-integrated learning experience in partnership with White Picket Fence Accounting & Taxation Services. We will be providing honorariums for the first time in recognition of their contributions to our Tax Clinic.

During this time of uncertainty, we provided 8 student volunteers the opportunity for a real-life experience in the field of taxation.

We get it, school is expensive. Tuition, fees, books, transit – it all adds up. And that doesn't include those extras that you may not have even realized you'd need. This year we partnered with Humber Advancement and Alumni and, for the first time, the University of Guelph-Humber.

252 students were assisted by our Learning Essentials Support program to help cover the cost of program materials not covered by tuition.

This program is available to full-time students of either campus who demonstrate financial need. They can receive a minimum of \$50 up to a maximum amount of \$500, depending on the value of the learning essential item(s) identified by their program.




